



THE RECORDING WON'T PLAY

Zoom recordings work much like an old VHS machine. Some of the control symbols are the same, plus there are some extra controls.

When you type in your passcode, Zoom will present you with the recording that looks like the example below. **The PLAY “button” is in the lower left corner of the main window. Hover on the corner until you see the button, then click on it and the recording will begin.** Please note: there is usually a set of announcement slides that rotate before the lecture actually begins. These slides help us communicate with all of our students, whether they are attending class on campus, watching the live stream, or viewing the recording.

The lecturer will appear to the right in a small window. Underneath the small window is a running audio transcript. If this viewing format doesn't suit you, you may click on the “button” in the lower right corner of the large window to make the lecture full screen. However, you may only see the lecture slides and the image of the lecturer may disappear. Or, the lecturer may appear “picture-in-picture.” It depends on your device. If you don't like this view, click on the lower right corner to revert to the original viewing format. These are the only two viewing options Zoom Webinar provides for recordings.
